From the artist ...

As a storyteller of the African narrative, I use visuals to educate the international community about the often misinterpreted stories of Africa. My goal is to present a fresh perspective that highlights the continent's diverse realities, allowing audiences to draw new conclusions.

I believe it's crucial to offer a positive outlook, as Africa is frequently portrayed negatively. By showcasing a different side of Africa, I aim to inspire curiosity and encourage people to explore and understand its complexities more deeply.

Through my imagery, I hope to foster a more nuanced perception that goes beyond stereotypes. I am a conceptual portraiture photographer who also ventures into documentary, using this tool to address issues that have a direct or indirect impact on my life using everyday items in my photographs to create that sense of relatability with my audience.

In "Pain through Belonging," I continue my exploration of choice-making as a means of belonging, focusing specifically on my mother's experiences within a religious group that brought her both pain and a sense of identity. This conceptual portrait series examines three key aspects: first, the influenced choices she faced, particularly through my father's guidance and the perceived influence of the Holy Spirit, highlighting how these forces shaped her decisions. Second, I explore the dual nature of choice-making and belonging, emphasizing that despite external influences, my mother ultimately had to navigate her own path and invest effort

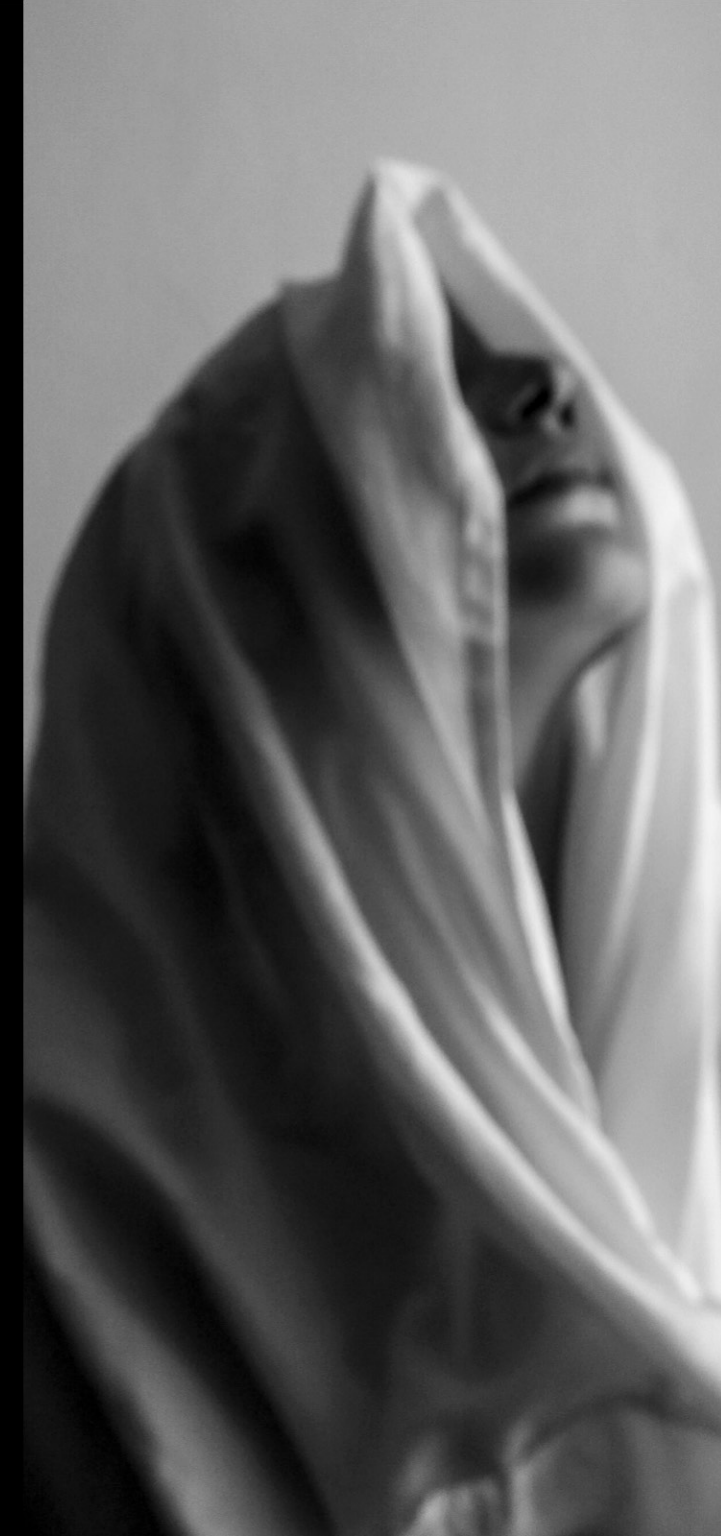
into her place within the community.

Lastly, I delve into the pain of separation that emerged when my parents divorced at the beginning of last year, illustrating the conflicting feelings of sorrow and relief my mother experienced. Through this work, I aim to convey the intricate relationships between choice, identity, and emotional turmoil as narrated through my mother's story and my observations.

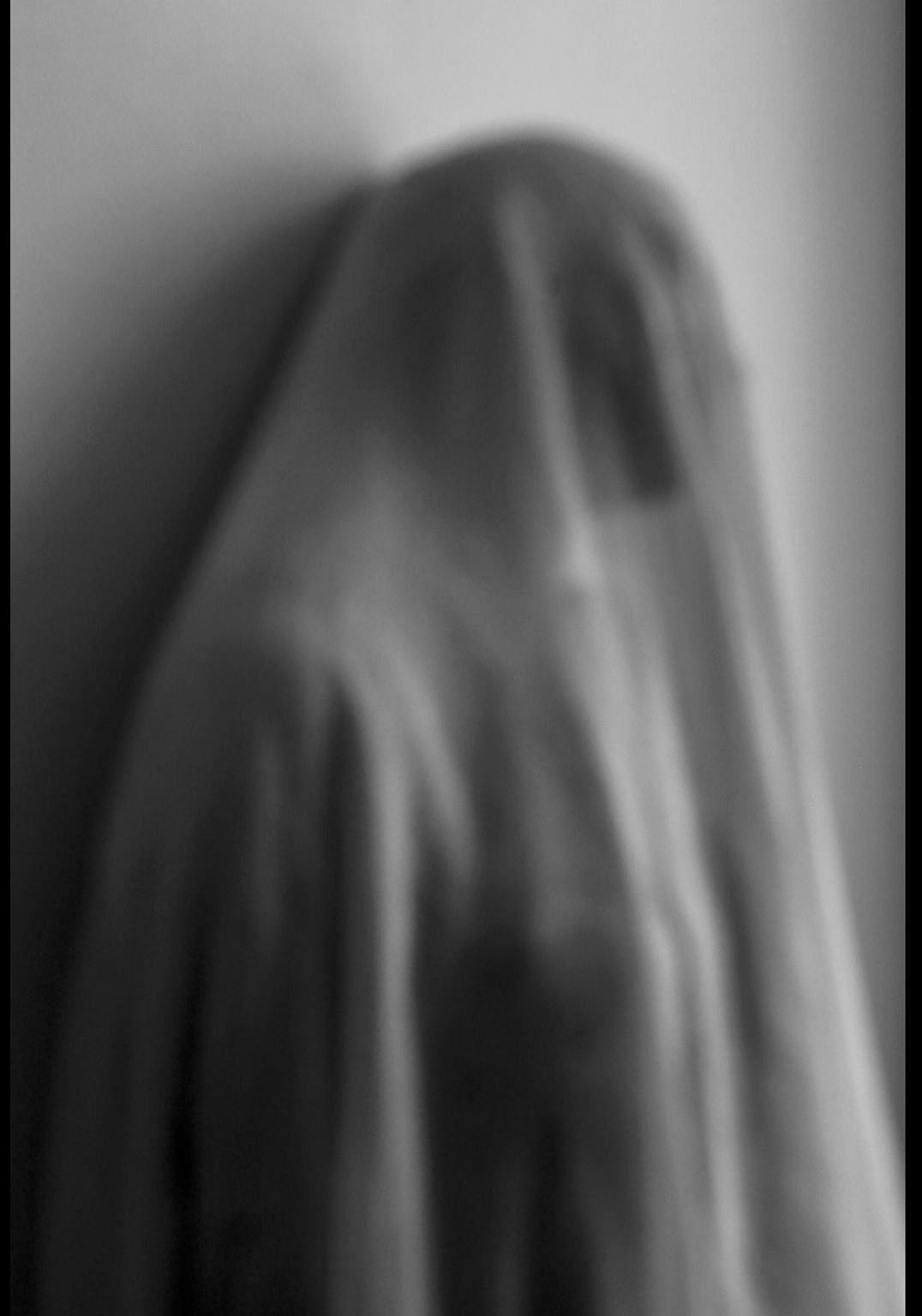

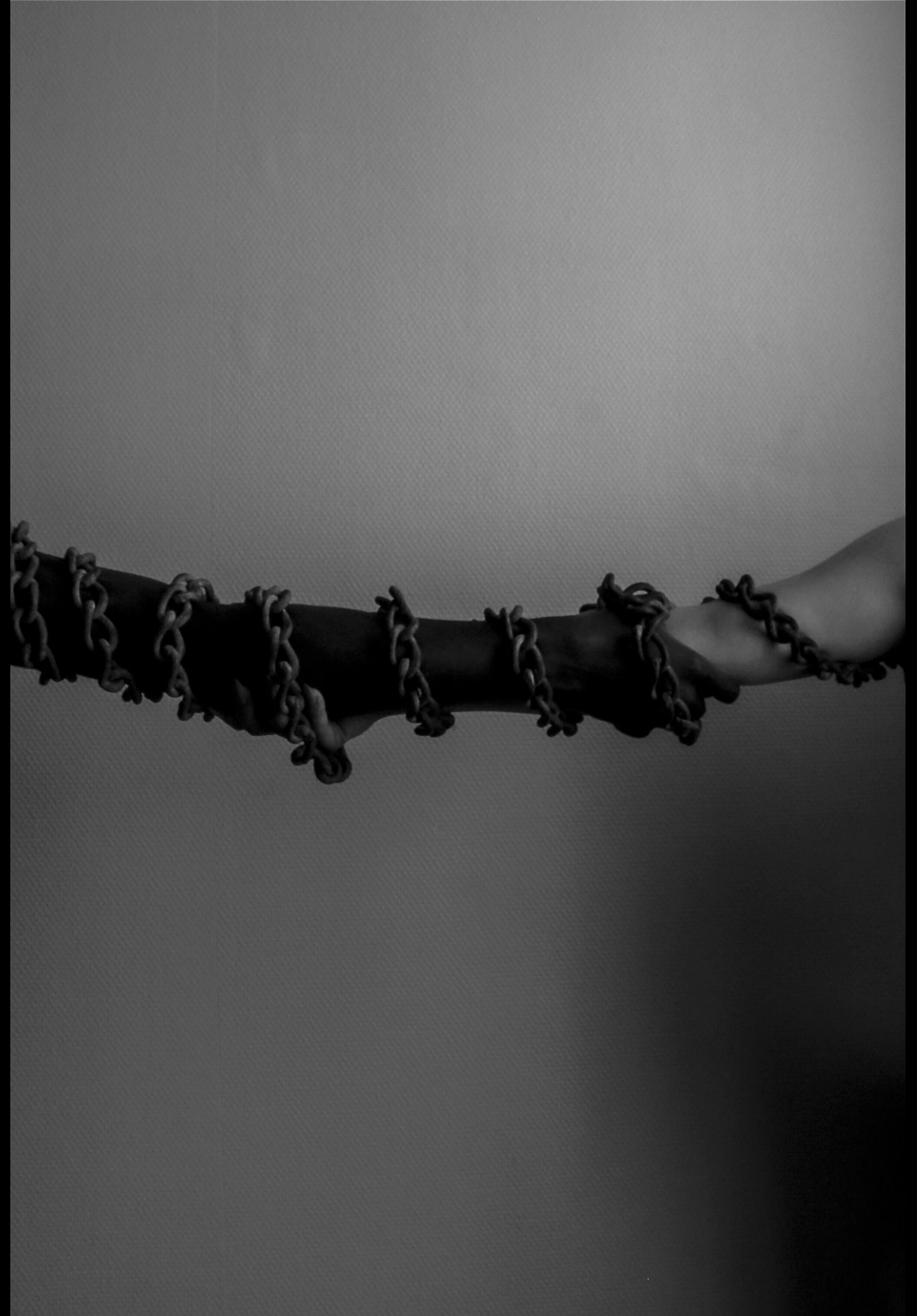
